PIONEER DAYS TO MODERN WAYS AT THE 2017 SISKIYOU GOLDEN FAIR ENTER TO WIN COLD HARD CASH!

YREKA - Remember the good old days when an entry into the fair was eligible to win first, second or third place in class and then rewarded with cold hard cash – Well those days are returning for the 2017 Siskiyou Golden Fair! The 10th District Agricultural Association Board of Directors and Staff worked to create policy that will allow exhibitors to collect the premium monies in CASH while visiting the fair. It came to our attention that a few other fairs have gone to the Cash premium system and reported favorable results so the Siskiyou Golden Fair has taken the necessary steps to bring that here. “Budget and staffing cuts caused the fair to go to larger best of show premium checks for the last few years but a few other fairs have gone to a cash payout system and it just feels right to go back to Pioneer Days and bring this new payout method back to the Siskiyou Golden Fair this year” state CEO Cliff Munson, “Siskiyou County Exhibitors asked for this change and we are pleased to be able to try this new system for our patrons”.

The 2017 exhibitor handbook will be online and in the fair office by May 15th this year and as usual will have about 5000 different lots and that great “other” lot where you can enter anything not listed in every department. Our fair is an opportunity to showcase all that is Siskiyou County and we hope that everyone will enter at least one item in the 2017 fair and if victorious come on out and collect their premiums in cold hard cash right at the fair. Siskiyou County residents have amazing talents, products and livestock and each year we exhibit items in lots that have been a part of the fair since the beginning in 1859 like quilts and beef cattle to the more modern like turkeys and all new this year portable chicken coops!
